August 24, 2005 Minutes

1. Rick Allen opened the meeting with introductions.
2. Approval of Minutes: Marty Campbell moved, James Collins seconded to approve the minutes with the addition of Phillip Brooke as an excused member. Passed.
3. Remaining Techniques: The groups working on the Department of Corrections and Western State supervision and discharge practices will finalize their work at a later meeting. Western State staff was not able to complete a response to the questions raised at the last meeting. Their response likely will be available for the September 14 meeting. Panel work groups will continue the discussion on both of these systems at that meeting.

Four other techniques remain: housing levy, inclusionary zoning, quality providers and neighborhood "tactics". The inclusionary zoning issue will be presented as a possible land use technique for the Planning Commission to consider. The housing levy is a method to develop affordable housing throughout the City. The housing levy is not targeted to high risk/high needs residents, but rather to persons who can not afford or struggle to afford current market rate housing. The Panel will focus its efforts on quality programs and neighborhood tactics.
4. The Panel divided into groups to discuss the characteristics and practices of quality housing and service providers. These characteristic and practices will lead to tools that can be used to create the "community model for affecting change" as directed by the Council. (Attached)

Members asked that a timeline of activities be developed and provided to Panel members.
